






Study Finds Inaccuracies in Electronic Health Records for Ophthalmic Medications

Medication lists generated from electronic health records (EHRs) may not capture up-to-date and accurate information on ophthalmic medications, according to a new study published in *JAMA Ophthalmology.*

EHRs are one example of how technology can improve patient care through data capture, but the study highlights the shortcomings of using EHR medication lists.

Patients Give Positive EHR Feedback, Though Accuracy Concerns Remain

A large share of patients have reported that their physicians' use of an EHR (electronic health record) has made the quality of care they receive and their interactions with their physicians better.

The data, coming from the January 2019 KFF (Kaiser Family Foundation) <u>Health Tracking Poll</u>, which included responses from nearly 1,200 U.S. adults, examines the public's attitudes about and experiences with EHRs. Researchers note that at the beginning of the healthcare reform debate in 2009, KFF polls showed the public held mixed views of EHRs. Most said it would improve care (67 percent), but fewer believed it would reduce healthcare costs (22 percent) and large shares had privacy concerns (59 percent).

Definition of eHRSS data incident



- Patient clinical data assess through eHRSS portal






